Under direction of the Director, Facility Planning, Construction and Management, the Deputy Director administers the California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation's (CDCR/Department), statewide capital outlay planning and budget process, land acquisition projects, and manages the design, construction, and renovation of prison housing units, prison support buildings and programming space.

Typical duties include the following:

- Evaluates CDCR's facility portfolio to ensure the ongoing operational needs of the department are met, (e.g., oversight of prison capacity calculations and projections of future housing needs). Acts as the liaison with Wardens and headquarters administrators regarding space requirements for prison support services and rehabilitation programs; directs the development of project scope, schedules, and budgets; reviews administrative procedures to ensure compliance with efficiency and standardization of operations requirements; reviews existing construction delivery methods and procedures to ensure

optimum results; and oversees fiscal management of funding sources and financing utilized for construction, and the Inmate Ward Labor Construction Services Program.

- Represents the Director, Facility Planning, Construction and Management in hearings before the Legislature and in meetings with individual legislators, the Department of Finance, the Governor's Office staff, other state, federal, and local agencies, and acts as liaison with statewide organizations.
- Serves as a member of the Director's Executive Operating Team and participates in executive level strategy planning, policy making, and priority setting for the Department and its facilities.

DESIRABLE QUALIFICATIONS

- Demonstrated broad administrative or program manager experience with substantial participation in the formulation, operation, and/or evaluation of policies in areas including, but not limited to, capital outlay planning and land acquisition projects.
- Experience in the management of a comprehensive facility management program for a large multi-faceted agency or organization and knowledge of design, construction, and renovation of juvenile or adult correctional facilities.
- Experience in the formulation and implementation of procedures, policies, and programs related to designing, constructing, and renovating prison housing units, prison support buildings, and reentry program facilities.
- Demonstrated experience in representing the Department before the Legislature, control agencies, local government, and other state, federal, and local agencies on policy level issues related to facility planning.
- Managerial and program administrative experience which includes substantial responsibility for a combination of management functions such as program planning, policy formulation, organization coordination and control, and fiscal and personnel management.
- Extensive experience and knowledge of administrative management, personnel, and leadership which demonstrates the ability to plan, organize, and direct multidisciplinary staff and appropriate techniques in the areas of selection, training, motivation and staff recognition, progressive discipline, and a manager's role in and effectively contributing to the Departments Equal Employment Opportunity objectives and mission.
- Ability to analyze complex problems and recommend effective courses of action, make independent, sound, ethical decisions regarding highly sensitive matters, and maintain confidentiality using collaborative, evidence-based processes.
