The Deputy Director, Center for Chronic Disease Prevention and Health Promotion, CDPH, manages and directs policy development on a wide range of public health and environmental health issues. The Deputy Director, Center for Chronic Disease Prevention and Health Promotion (CCDPHP) will have a lead role in addressing issues related to chronic disease, injury control, environmental and occupational diseases. The Deputy Director is the liaison with other state, federal, and local governmental entities including the California Health and Human Services Agency, the Governor's Office, and the Legislature and with California business and health care communities. The CCDPHP consists of approximately 500 health professionals and support staff within two divisions: the Division of Chronic Disease and Injury Control and the Division of Environmental and Occupational Disease Control. The Deputy Director ensures the activities and policies of CCDPHP programs are consistent with the Directorate's strategic vision and goals for public health in California.

Qualifications

- Ability to function as part of an executive management team to plan, develop and implement department policies and priorities.
- Ability to lead and manage a professional multidisciplinary team.
- Proven ability to interact with and engage stakeholders.
- Ability to effectively plan for and manage changes in department priorities and operations necessary to respond to public health emergences.
- Ability to communicate effectively, orally and in writing, with the Governor's Office, the Health and Human Services Agency, CDPH executives, other

state and federal agencies, the Legislature, and CDPH partners, including local health departments.

Desirable Characteristics

- Experience with a broad range of public health programs.
- Executive level experience in planning, organizing, and operating policy and program activities for a large public or private entity.
- A track record of recruiting, managing, and retaining top-level managers who function effectively as a team.
- Formal training in public health.

Interested candidates should submit:

- A resume;
- Three professional references (name, telephone number, and email address);
- A statement of qualifications, no more than three pages in length, that
 describes how the candidate's background and experience specifically
 relates to the ability to perform the duties of this position.

Statement of Qualifications

In addition to your resume, all interested applicants are required to submit a Statement of Qualifications with specific information on how his/her background, knowledge, skills, and abilities meet the minimum qualifications, desirable qualifications, and desirable characteristics. The Statement of Qualifications must discuss the following critical factors:

- Describe your experience dealing with high level managers and policy makers within the Executive Branch, the Legislature, control agencies, and local health departments.
- 2. Describe your experience working with non-governmental stakeholders and advisory groups to help develop state policies and programs.
- Describe your ability and experience in conducting broad based policy analysis and developing crosscutting strategic policies including possible involvement of multiple departments, agencies and legislative staff.
- 4. Describe your experience in overseeing, leading and managing a professional multidisciplinary team.

- 5. Describe your ability and experience in addressing public health and environmental health policies pertaining to the health status of California's population.
- 6. Describe your experience in conducting policy analysis and developing strategic policies and plans regarding specific issues affecting California's population in the following areas: Mortality reduction due to chronic environmental and occupational diseases, injuries and associated risk factors; promoting healthy lifestyles; encouraging the reduction of health-related risk-taking behaviors; and promoting informed discussion in these areas of public health with stakeholders and the public.
