The California Department of Veterans Affairs is seeking a dynamic Executive Director/Veterans Home Administrator to manage the Veterans Home of California in Chula Vista. The ideal candidate will supervise departmental managers in the daily operations of the Veterans Home, ensuring continuity and consistency in delivery and quality of services and compliance with applicable state and federal standards, regulations and guidelines. The candidate will implement approaches and services to maintain or enhance resident independence and resident satisfaction. The candidate will also participate in veteran events and marketing activities while developing and implementing an annual business plan that achieves the financial goals and maintains high occupancy through marketing strategies. We are seeking professionals who are eager to touch the lives of our nation's heroes. It's a commitment that promotes countless rewards not only to our residents but to our employees as well by providing meaningful services to render the optimum level of resident care.

ABOUT THE FACILITY:

Located on a 30-acre site adjacent to Sharp Chula Vista Medical Center, the Veterans Home of California, Chula Vista (VHC-Chula Vista), is the only veterans home located in coastal, urban Southern California. With views of the Pacific Ocean and downtown San Diego, VHC-Chula Vista's location provides residents with numerous cultural and recreational opportunities.

Completed in May 2000, VHC-Chula Vista is a 400-bed long-term care facility providing options for Domiciliary/Independent Living, Licensed Residential, and Skilled Nursing Care. Employed physicians provide medical care in both the licensed outpatient clinic and the inpatient skilled nursing settings. Acute care is provided at either the La Jolla U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs Medical Center, or at the nearby Sharp Hospital in Chula Vista.

DUTIES:

Under general direction, this position reports to the CalVet Undersecretary for Veterans Homes, the Deputy Secretary for Veterans Homes, and the Governing Body. This individual is responsible for securing and/or maintaining the licensure at the Home. Major functions include, but are not limited to:

- Ensure that the Home meets all licensing and certification standards through planning, training, physical facility improvement, policies, and procedures. Develop ongoing contacts with regulatory agencies such as the Department of Health Services, California Medical Association, United States Department of Veterans Affairs, The Department of Social Services, and the Veterans Administration.
- Supervise all personnel and monitor staffing levels for efficiencies and long term planning. Oversee facility and equipment maintenance program.
- Establish priorities and implement strategies to maintain high quality of care to Veteran residents while closely monitoring all revenue and costs.
- Coordinate the development of the Agency's annual budget relating to the Home. Appear at hearings with the Department of Finance and legislative budgetary committees as requested.
- Represent the Home within the community and participate in extensive networking with local private and public organizations.
- Review and make recommendations to the Undersecretary regarding proposed legislation that affects the care of aged, homeless, and/or disabled veterans.
- Successful candidate must also have the ability to understand and comply with a complex system of laws and regulations to include: Health and Safety Code-Division 2 Chapter 3.3, Welfare and Institutions Code-Division 9 Chapter 8.7, Title 22-Division 1.8 Chapter 1.5 (Department of Aging Regulations). Title 22-Division 3 Chapter 5 (Medical Certification Regulations), Title 22-Division 5 Chapter 10 (Licensing Regulations), and Title 22-Division 6 Chapter 8 (Residential Care for the Elderly).
